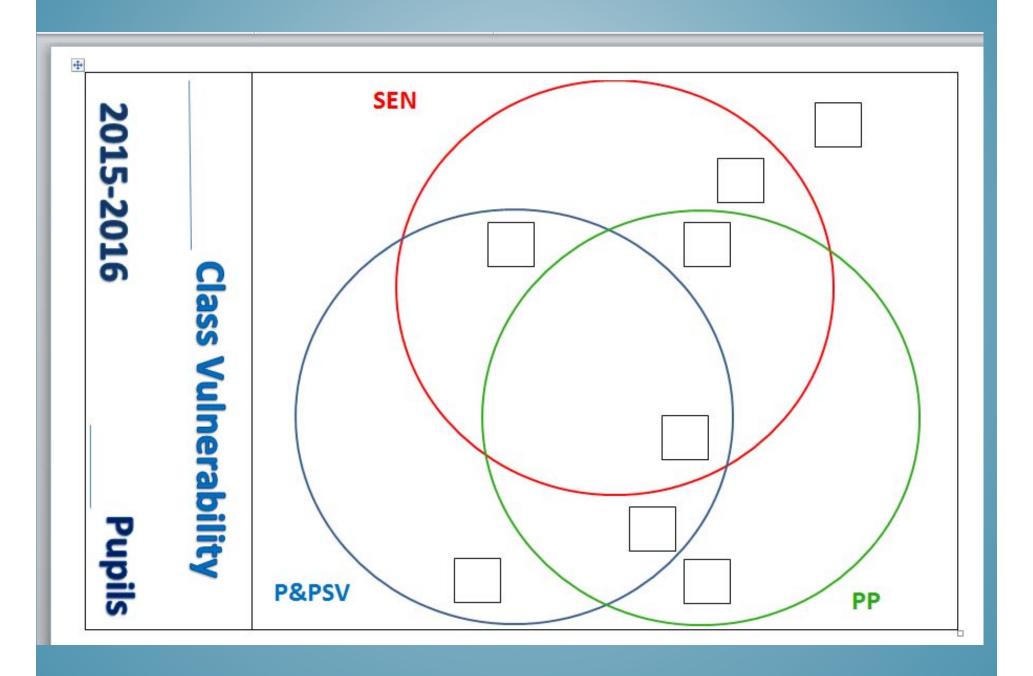

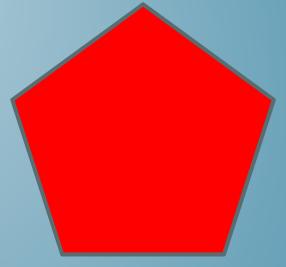
- Class composition lists created by Inclusion team and shared with staff

- Class lists including photos of PPSV distributed to classes.



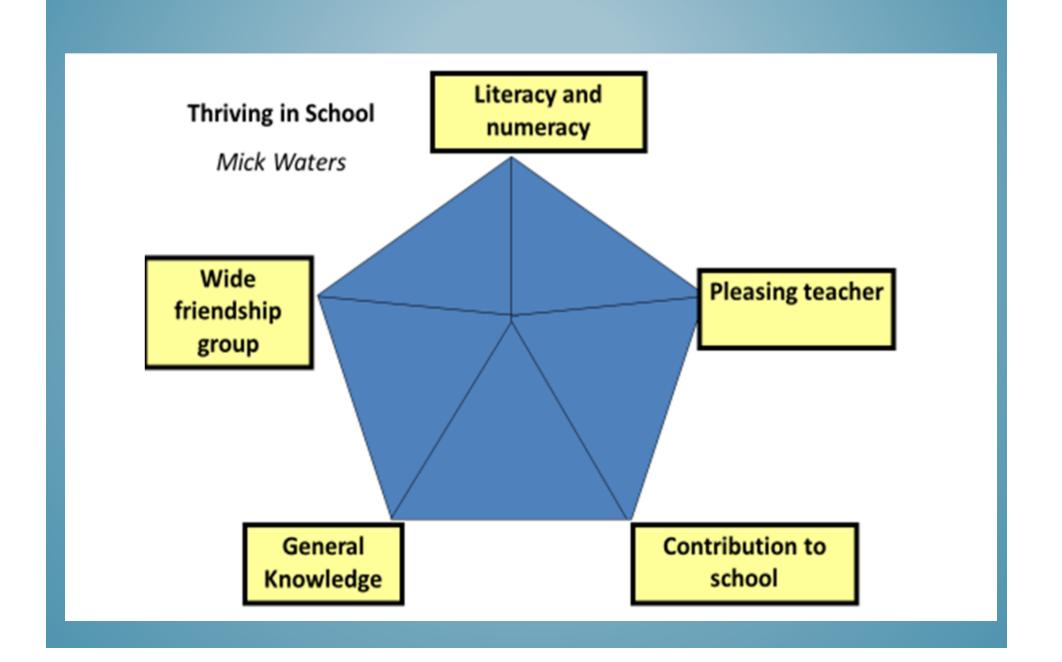

 - Recording the wide range of support and feedback from the different agencies and staff within the school (school counsellor, EWO, Speech and Language Therapist, Intervention monitoring) to assess impact



- Use of data to identify the gaps
- Gaps Analysis year group tracker identifies key year groups where additional focus and support may be required
- Pupil Progress meetings
- Pupil conferencing PP focus each term
