
This term year 4 have been learning all about mythical creatures in Greek mythology. The local library got in touch with Year 4 and asked if they

Amelia's design from 4W


Vince's design from 4A




WE HAVE BUDDING COMPUTER PROGRAMMERS!!


Hello My name is Miss Archer

We had a great time and sang beautifully









CHRISTMAS TREE CUPCAKES

Ingredients

- 125g caster sugar
- 130g softened butter
- 30g cocoa powder

- 2 tbsp milk

- 2 medium eggs 1 tbsp vanilla extract

- 125g butter
- 250g icing sugar
- Green food colouring Assorted sprinkles

For the butter icing:

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C / Gas Mark 4.
- 2. Cream together the butter and sugar, using an electric mixer until the mixture is light and fluffy.
- 3. Add the eggs one at a time, mixing well in between. Then add the vanilla extract and stir.
- 4. Gradually sieve the flour and cocoa powder in the bowl. Fold into the mixture using a large metal spoon.
- 5. If the mixture is too thick, add milk and mix together. The mixture should have a smooth, 'gloopy' consistency.
- 6. Spoon the mixture into cake cases and bake for around 15 minutes use a skewer or knife to see whether the cupcakes are cooked all the way through. Then leave to cool before icing.
- 7. To make the butter icing, sieve the icing sugar into a bowl and add the butter and a few drops of food colouring. Mix with an electric mixer (be careful, it will go everywhere!).
- 8. Add the icing to a piping bag, and pipe onto the cupcakes. Swirl upwards to look like a tree - then decorate with sprinkles and silver balls.

SPORTS

Park Primary have again had a jam packed sporting schedule having already taken part in a Year 3/4 football tournament, football team league and cup matches, girls football tournament and league matches, tag rugby league, sportshall athletics and a Kabaddi festival.

Boys Football Team

It's been an up and down start to this year's football team. With arguably our strongest team for some time the team started the season brightly winning our first two games; a friendly versus St Patrick's 4—3 and 10-1 defeating St Peter's in the league cup. Our first league game was against strong opposition in Hanham Abbots which turned out to be a disappointing 3-0 loss. A break in league and cup fixtures saw us take part in the English schools football competition at Filton Wise Campus. The team played out of their skins for the whole tournament, only conceding one goal and winning the final 1-0 vs St Michael's with a late goal from Leo Ferrante. This saw us progress to the South Glos finals at the GFA Headquarters at which however we didn't perform as well as we could and were knocked out, only scoring 1 point from 3 games. It was a tremendous effort from all the boys to reach this stage of the competition. A special mention to JACK WOODLAND for some outstanding goalkeeping throughout both competitions.

Back to league and cup action. In the cup we again came up against Hanham Abbots and again came up short in a close game losing 4-2. In the league, November finished strong with a 7—2 win over Longwell Green and a solid 1-1 draw away to St Anne's. The season still has a long way to go with many games to be played and lots of points to be won.

Girls Football

This year the girls football team has been boosted by the addition of several girls from Parkwall who have settled into the team well. We began the year with a football tournament where the girls outclassed their opponents, winning every game in the group stages. They were then matched against a strong team in the quarter finals, and a small goal kick error led to a last minute goal from the other team. Although we went out in the quarter finals it was great to see the newly formed team trying to play real football by passing and moving. Next up was our first league game against Cadbury Heath who are another strong and established team. We arguably played much better football and were unlucky to lose 3-0. The majority of the game was spent in the opponents' half. It was just one of those days where no matter how hard the girls tried, they couldn't get the ball in the back of the net! Despite the loss, the girls went into the next league game against St Anne's feeling positive and they deserved to win 4-2. Once again, they played great football throughout the whole match, always looking to pass the ball around and shoot when the goal was in sight. It was a stand out performance from Alana Reilly who had a strong half in goal and then came out of goal in the second half to score a goal almost instantly. She was even close to having a second in the final stages of the match. Fingers crossed the winning streak will continue into the new year! It's also been great to see so many girls joining the football club and turning up to weekly training sessions. We are hoping to arrange some friendlies to give more of the girls the opportunity to play in competitive matches.

Last month on a bitterly cold Friday afternoon we took our Yr 5/6 team along to the Cleve Rugby tournament. In past years we haven't quite performed to our full potential in this tournament so we had something to prove. It did not stop raining from the minute we got there until the minute we went home and at one point we found ourselves dashing to the bushes mid-game to avoid the tennis ball sized hail stones!! When we did get down to playing we took a while to get going and after drawing the first group game we kicked on from there, winning the next 4 matches. It was at this point the tournament organisers decided to postpone the rest of the matches due to the weather. The tournament has been re-arranged for March where we will return as group winners along with 7 other schools who have qualified for the Quarter Finals.
