





Ray Bradbury – All Summer In A Day (Cracking Comprehension)

In "All Summer in a Day," a group of schoolchildren live on the planet Venus with their families. They are nine years old, and they are eagerly awaiting a momentous occasion. After 5 years of continuous rain, the scientists on Venus have predicted that the sun will come out today for a brief period of time.



2. Michael Morpurgo – Why the Whales Came (Cracking Comprehension)

Why the **Whales Came'** is about ten-year-old Gracie Jenkins, who lives on Bryher, a small island off the western coast of Britain, in the year 1914. ... The Birdman used to live on Samson Island, which people say has a curse on it. Gracie and her friend Daniel have a fleet of toy boats they have made.



3. E. Nesbit – The Railway Children (Cracking Comprehension)

This story centres around three **children** whose comfortable existence ends when their father has to go away unexpectedly. Roberta, Peter and Phyllis leave their London home and move with their mother to a small cottage in the country where life is very different.



Jill Paton Walsh – Shine (Cracking Comprehension)

Pattie and her family are among the last refugees to flee a dying Earth in an old spaceship. When the group finally lands on the distant planet which is to be their new home, it seems that the four-year journey has been a success. But as they settle in to this shiny new world, they discover that nothing on this planet is edible, and they may not be able to grow food.




Robert Louis Stevenson – Treasure Island (Cracking Comprehension)

Set in the eighteenth century, **Treasure Island** spins the tale of Jim Hawkins aboard the Hispaniola as he journeys across the Spanish Main in search for buried **treasure** on an exotic **isle**.



6. Richmal Crompton – Just William (Cracking Comprehension)

Meet everyone's favourite troublemaker in this classic book of short stories.




7. William Shakespeare – The Tempest (Cracking Comprehension)

Each boy is given a six-pound bag of **flour**, in rags, to form the look of a **baby**, and he must care for it at all times, as if it were a real **baby**...




10. Michael Morpurgo – Private Peaceful


12. Frank Cottrell Boyce – Millions


13. Morris Gleitzman – Once

Louis Sachar – Holes


Stanley has been unjustly sent to a boys' detention centre, Camp Green Lake, where the boys build character by spending all day, every day digging **holes**...

And so the first of the *Harry Potter* adventures is set to begin




16. Michelle Magorian – Goodnight Mr Tom


17. J R R Tolkein – The Hobbit


20. C S Lewis – The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe


21. Joan Aiken – The Wolves of Willoughby Chase


24. Peter Bunzi – Cogheart


25. Anthony Horowitz – Granny

When his parents are kidnapped, what's ten-year-old Charlie Ashanti to do? Rescue them, that's what!




28. Robert Westall – Machine Gunners
