Contingency Framework for Outbreaks of COVID-19

Working together to empower children to become aspirational, global citizens

It is our priority that education continues to operate as normally as possible during the COVID-19 pandemic and in particular from September 2021 onwards by

- maximising the number of children in face-to-face education and minimising any disruption in a way that best manages the COVID-19 risk
- ensuring any measures affect the minimum number of children for the shortest time
- implementing attendance restrictions only as a last resort
- prioritising our most vulnerable children for enhanced additional safeguarding measures

When should your child self-isolate of miss school

NO	All children MUST attend school unless they are ill or have tested positive for Covid	
	• They do not have to isolate if a member of their household or close contact has tested positive but should a PCR test and continue coming	
	to school	
YES	 If your child develops Covid symptoms at home – they should stay at home and book a PCR test (NOT LFD test) 	
	If your child develops Covid symptoms at school they will be sent home and you should book them a PCR test	
	• If your child tests positive for Covid they will need to self-isolate in line with current guidance (the rest of the household should book a PCR	
	test)
