Page 1

- Lessons to start with a **discussion** about Art work (painting/sculpture/textile) from the artist(s)/designer(s). Use "Thinking out loud" approach: "This reminds me of..." I wonder why it...?" Explore the Artist(s), their style and techniques. Form opinions on their work.
- Write the artist(s) and skill clear on page. For example: **Derek Gores Collage**
- Stick in pictures of the artist(s)/designer(s) art work and **annotate** facts, thoughts, and opinions, commenting on techniques, skills, style, colours, shapes, tones, form and space. Use more than one to make similarities and comparisons.
- Deconstruct/mimic/replicate parts of the art work or techniques around the same page - decorate the page in a creative artistic way using a variety of media (pencils, pens, pastels, paint, chalk, fabric, paper of choice).

Let the children be free to present this how they want and use what they want – allow freedom to be creative!

Page 2

- **Practice** skills, processes, sketches, mark making, prints, colour mixing drafts, designs, methods, inspired and influenced by the artist(s)

Page 3

- **Create** a piece of art using their design ideas and the skills, influence and or inspiration from the artist(s).

They should be given the opportunity to **reflect** on their Art work and **showcase** their work, allowing interpretations and opinions from other pupils using oracy skills.

Please check art examples/artists websites prior to ensure suitability/appropriateness.
