CSET Sports Partnership Membership £4071		This partnership gives us huge benefits towards all indicators: with guidance from the CSET co-ordinator, we monitor and improve on our "heat map" for physical activity on a daily basis; we have attended over 40 competitive competitions, most of which are celebrated on our social media pages to raise the profile of PE; 10 coaching hours for in-house CPD are given; and general CPD, latest initiatives are shared on a weekly basis allowing us to network with nearby schools.	CSET co-ordinator has frequently stated how impressive our provision at The Park is. Support is given by her to gain the desired Gold Award for the School Games Mark. More pupils than ever are asking to be part of our school matches and events, and continued high numbers of pupils have represented the school at events.

Resources are now clearly labelled and readily available for staff to make it quick and easy to collect resources to support delivery of high quality PE lessons. High stocks of key essentials such as tennis balls, footballs etc. ensures children are active for the majority of their PE lesson time (avoiding the need for queues/ waiting for turns etc). Children said they enjoyed PE lessons because of the variety of equipment they get to use and the range of different sports/activities that are offered to them over the course of the year.
